A BY-LAW TO DESIGNATE 48 EARL STREET TO BE OF ARCHITECTURAL VALUE OR INTEREST PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF THE ONTARIO HERITAGE ACT

This three-bay, two-storey frame house on stone foundation provides an interesting contrast to the designated stone and brick houses on either side of it. The asymmetrical facade, carefully rehabilitated and restored, is an excellent example of the 'stick style'. The gabled facade has fish scale shingles and a barge board with rectangular panels. The entrance porch with pierced wood cresting and gable is in the Eastlake style.
