THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF OAKVILLE BY-LAW 1989-264

A by-law to designate a certain property as a property of historical and architectural value and interest (1105 Sixth Line)

THE COUNCIL ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. The property municipally known as 1105 Sixth Line is hereby designated as a property of historical and architectural value and interest pursuant to the Ontario Heritage Act for the reasons set out in Schedule "A" to this by-law.
- 2. The property designated by this by-law is the property described in Schedule "B" attached to this by-law.

Reasons for Designation

Schedule "A"

The house at 1105 Sixth Line was built during the early 1870's for Jeremiah Hagaman. Hagaman, who was considered a "carriage maker of distinction", had established a carriage factory in Oakville. Hagaman was one of the first commercial cultivators of strawberries in Oakville. He was also a local politician, and was one of Oakville's first councillors representing Ward One from 1859 until at least 1862.

Architecturally, the house is a very good example of Second Empire architecture found in the Town of Oakville. The house exhibits a straight with flare mansard roof with hooded and scrolled dormers, bracketed cornice beneath the roof, patterned metal roof and decorative woodwork.

Contextually, the house at 1105 Sixth Line is a conspicuous and familiar feature in the neighbourhood and has acquired sentimental value.
