

A by-law to designate certain property as
property of historic and architectural
value and interest (2401-05 Ontario Street)

THE COUNCIL ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1. The property known municipally as 2401-05 Ontario Street is hereby designated as a property of historic and architectural value and interest pursuant to The Ontario Heritage Act, for the reason set out in Schedule "A" to this by-law.

REASON FOR DESIGNATION

This white frame, two and a half storey structure with steeply hipped roof was constructed circa 1845. Dormers and an addition on the back were added at a later date. The verandah with its wrought iron embellishments and decorative bracket mouldings, is noteworthy.

The building was originally Thompson's Hotel built by Ned Thompson circa 1845 and served as a stage coach stop on the old Lake Road, opened 1832, between Toronto and the Head of the Lake. Subsequently it was a grocery store, candy shop, post office and, in the early 1900s, a summer hotel. It was named "Glendella" in 1887.
