BY-LAW NUMBER 1987-24

A by-law to designate certain property as property of historic and architectural value and interest (3565 Lakeshore Road West)

THE COUNCIL ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. The property known municipally as 3565 Lakeshore Road West is hereby designated as a property of historic and architectural value and interest persuant to the Ontario Heritage Act, for the reason set out in Schedule "A" to this by-law.
- 2. The property designated by this by-law is the property described in Schedule "B" and Schedule "C" attached to this by-law.

SCHEDULE "A"

By-Law 1987-24

REASON FOR DESIGNATION:

This building was constructed circa 1860 by Samuel Curtis, an early dairy farmer in the area. The brick structure with bargeboard trim and cut stone under the windows is representative of Gothic style typical of that period. Few houses embodying gothic features remain in Oakville.


SCHEDULE "B"

By-Law 1987-24

ALL AND SINGULAR that certain parcel or tract of land and premises situate, lying and being in the Town of Oakville, in the Regional Municipality of Halton, and being composed of Block 227 on Plan 20M-316 (Town of Oakville) registered in the Land Registry Office No. 20 for the Land Titles Division of Halton at Milton.

SUBJECT TO AN EASEMENT in favour of the Regional Municipality of Halton over that part of Block 227 on Plan 20M-316 designated as Part 51 on Plan 20R-6699, subject to the conditions and convenants and for the purposes as set our in Instrument 231765.
