

TAKE NOTICE THAT Oakville Town Council, by by-law, on September 6, 1978 did designate a certain property as a property of historic and architectural value and interest. The by-law is detailed below, together with an explanation of the reason for the designation:

THE COUNCIL ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1. The property commonly known and referred to as the Knox Presbyterian Church Sixteen is hereby designated as property of historic and architectural value and interest pursuant to The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974.
2. The property designated by this by-law is the property described in Schedule "A" to this by-law.

SCHEDULE "A" to By-law Number 1978-85

THAT part of Lot 22 in Concession 1, South of Dundas Street formerly in the Township of Trafalgar, County of Halton, now in the Town of Oakville, Regional Municipality of Halton, designated as Part 2 on a Plan of Survey of Record in the Land Registry Office for the Land Titles Division of Halton at Milton as 20R-1938.

REASON FOR DESIGNATION

The Knox Presbyterian Church Sixteen is a well preserved example of a Gothic style county church displaying pointed arch windows and door openings with heavy buttresses at the corners and front and side walls. Historically the Church congregation dates back to 1844 and was associated with the area once known as the Sixteen Community. The original wood framed church was built in 1846 and was brick veneered in 1899.
