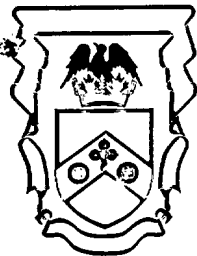

**NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE**

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Aylmer intends to designate the property, including land and buildings, at the following municipal address as a property of architectural and historical value or interest, under PART 1V of the *Ontario Heritage Act*, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter O.18.

62 Talbot Street East, being described as Blk. 1, Pt. Lot 5, Registered Plan 74, lying on the South-West corner of Talbot Street East and King Street

The reasons for the proposed designation as approved by the Aylmer Heritage Committee and Town Council may be reviewed by interested individuals at the Office of the Town Clerk.

Any person may, within thirty days of the first publication of this notice, that date being April 8, 2005, send by registered mail or deliver to the Clerk of the Town of Aylmer notice of objection to the proposed designation together with a statement of the reasons for the objection and all relevant facts. If such a Notice is received, the Council of the Town of Aylmer shall refer the matter to the Conservation Review Board for a Hearing.
