## SCHEDULE THE CORPORATION OF THE

TOWN OF PELHAM BY-LAW #981 (1985)

Being a by-law to designate the property known municipally as 495 Canboro Road West as being of architectural and historical value or interest.

WHEREAS Section 29 of The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974 authorizes the Council of a municipality to enact by-laws to designate real property, including all buildings and structures thereon, to be of architectural or historic value or interest;

AND WHEREAS the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Pelham has caused to be served on the owners of the lands and premises known as The Pollard House at 495 Canboro Road West and upon the Ontario Heritage Foundation, notice of intention to so designate the aforesaid real property and has caused such notice of intention to be published in the same newspaper having general circulation in the municipality once for each of three consecutive weeks;

AND WHEREAS no notice of objection to the proposed designation has been served on the Clerk of the municipality;

NOW THEREFORE THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF PELHAM ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

- (1) There is designated as being of architectural and historical value or interest the real property known as The Pollard House at 495 Canboro Road West, more particularly described in Schedule "A" hereto.
- (2) The Municipal Solicitor is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be registered against the property described in Schedule "A" hereto in the proper Land Registry Office.
- (3) The Clerk is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be served on the owner of the aforesaid property and on the Ontario Heritage Foundation and to cause notice of the passing of this by-law to be published in the same newspaper having general circulation in the municipality once for each of three consecutive weeks.

DESCRIPTION

THOSE lands and premises located in the following municipality, namely, in the Town of Pelham, in the Regional Municipality of Niagara, and being composed of part of the northwest part of Lot No. 9 in the 9th. Concession of said Township of Pelham described as follows:

COMMENCING at the northwest angle of said lot;

THENCE East 90 feet to a stake;

THENCE South 148 feet more or less to Canboro Road;

THENCE Westerly along the northern boundary of said road 104 feet more or less to the western boundary of said lot;

THENCE North 173 feet more or less to the place of beginning.

## NOTICE OF PASSING OF BY-LAW

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Pelham has passed by—law #981 (1985) to designate the following properties as being of architectural and historical value or interest under Part IV of The Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1980, Chapter 337:

(a) 495 Canboro Road - REASONS: --

The Pollard House is of historical value as the site of an early Post Office in the Township of Pelham (1888-1914);

And That the property is of architectural value as being an example of the mid-Victorian vernacular style typical of Pelham; and retaining significant original features, including ornamental fretwork and a porch-verandah.
