NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Simcoe intends to designate the Bandstand in the area of Lynnwood Park, Simcoe, Ontario, for its local and regional architectural and historical importance under Part IV of The Ontario Heritage Act R.S.O. 1980 Chapter 337.

REASONS FOR DESIGNATION

This bandstand is typical of the many such structures which were built at the turn of the century. Its architectural design is fanciful and decorative, expressing well the optimism and prosperity associated with the Edwardian period of history.

As time has passed, more and more of these park structures have disappeared. The once popular park concerts have been replaced by different forms of entertainment. In spite of changing times the Bandstand is still regarded by many citizens as a landmark. Architecturally it is a unique and important landmark richly deserving repair, continuing maintenance, and a full program of outdoor community events.

The Bandstand has recently been restored with the assistance of interested citizens and a local Service Club and moved from its original setting to a new location in the park area.

The building is deemed worthy of protection under The Ontario Heritage Act.

Any person may, before the 11th day of March 1982, send by registered mail or deliver to the Clerk of the Town of Simcoe notice of his or her objection to the proposed designation, together with a statement of the reasons for the objection and all relevant facts. When a Notice of Objection has been received, the Council of the Town of Simcoe will refer the matter to the Conservation Review Board for a hearing and report.
