A BY-LAW TO DESIGNATE THE PROPERTY KNOWN
MUNICIPALLY AS THE GILROY FARM, Part of
the West $\frac{1}{2}$ of Lot 28, Concession 2, former

AS BEING OF ARCHITECTURAL AND/OR HISTORICAL
VALUE OR INTEREST

WHEREAS section 29 of The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974
authorizes the Council of a municipality to enact by-laws
to designate real property, including all buildings and
structures thereon, to be of architectural or historic
value or interest; and

WHEREAS the Council of the Corporation of the Township
of Rideau has caused to be served on the owners of the
lands and premises known as The Gilroy Farm, being part
of the West $\frac{1}{2}$ of Lot 28, Concession 2, of the former
Township of Marlborough.
and upon the Ontario Heritage Foundation, notice of
intention to so designate the aforesaid real property and
has caused such notice of intention to be published in the
same newspaper having general circulation in the municipality
one for each of three consecutive weeks; and

WHEREAS no notice of objection to the proposed designation
has been served on the Clerk of the municipality;


THEREFORE the Council of the Corporation of the Township of
Rideau enacts as follows:

- 1) There is designated as being of architectural and/or
historical value of interest the real property known as

- 2) The municipal solicitor is hereby authorized to cause
a copy of this by-law to be registered against the property

on the Ontario Heritage Foundation and to cause notice of the
passing of this by-law to be published in the same newspaper
having general circulation in the municipality once for each
of three consecutive weeks.

third time and passed this 1st day of March, 1979.



BY-LAW NO. 30/79

PROPERTY DESIGNATED - The Gilroy Farm, part of the west half of Lot 28, Concession 2, the former Township of Marlborough.

REASONS FOR DESIGNATION - The Gilroy Farm is the finest existing example in the Township of a complete log homestead. The house and some outbuildings were built by 1861 with the remainder pre-1900. The farm site, now in the Regional Forest reserve with no visual 20th century intrusions nearby, is an interesting example of a simple early homestead.
