THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF PERTH

BY LAW NO. 2665

A By-Law to designate a certain property within the Municipality to be of historic or architectural value or interest

WHEREAS Chapter 337 of the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1980 provides that the Council of a Municipality may, by by-law, designate a property within the Municipality to be of historical or architectural value or interest.

AND WHEREAS notice of intention to designate a certain property within the Municipality was served on the owner of the property and the Ontario Heritage Foundation, May 16, 1986 and was published in the Perth Courier May 21, May 28 and June 4, 1986.

AND WHEREAS no objections were received against the designation of the said property as a result of the aforementioned notices:

NOW THEREFORE, the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Town of Perth ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1. The following property be and is hereby designated to be of historic or architectural value or interest:

Description: The building and property at 22 Wilson Street West and more particularly described in Schedule "A" attached hereto.

Owner: [REDACTED]

Reason For Designation:

One and a half storey, stone with wood frame shed attached. Centre ground floor entrance with a fanlight and sidelights surrounding door. A later addition classically inspired front porch, two windows, one on each side of the entrance maintain the classic proportions of the building.

Dr. James Nichol was one of the first surgeons in Perth; he was also gaol surgeon and a Justice of the Peace.

This building is one of the last of the early private residences turned commercial to maintain its residential setting on one of the main streets.

2. This by-law shall come into force and take effect on the passing thereof.

READ a first, second and third time and passed this twentyfourth day of June, 1986.
