TAKE NOTICE that the Council of The Corporation of the City of Ottawa on the 20th day of January 1982, enacted By-law Number 18-82 designating the lands and buildings known municipally as 199-205 Daly Avenue as a property of architectural value or interest under the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1980, c. 337.

STATEMENT OF REASONS FOR THE DESIGNATION:

The building at 199-205 Daly Avenue is recommended for designation as being of architectural value. The three door brick row structure with a pitched roof was constructed in 1868. In its overall exterior appearance the building is a good example of an early investment property built during the development of the Sandy Hill area.

The building is distinguished by the regular spacing of window and door openings, the contrasting brick on the window lintels and on the corners of the building, the gabled front entrance porches, the gabled dormers, and the eaves brackets.

A by-law of The Corporation of the City of Ottawa to to be 199-205 Daly Avenue designate of architectural value or interest; WHEREAS the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1980, c. 337, authorizes the Council of a municipality to enact by-laws to designate real property, including all the buildings and structures thereon, to be of architectural value or interest; AND WHEREAS the Council of The Corporation of the City of Ottawa has caused to be served upon the owner of the lands and premises known as 199-205 Daly Avenue more particularly described in Schedule "A" hereto, and upon the Ontario Heritage Foundation, notice of intention to so designate the aforesaid real property and has caused such notice of intention to be published in the Ottawa Citizen newspaper having a general circulation in the City of Ottawa, once a week for three consecutive weeks, namely on the 31st day of October, the 7th and 14th days of November, 1981; AND WHEREAS the reasons for the designation are set out as Schedule "B" hereto; AND WHEREAS no notice of objection to the said proposed designation has been served upon the Clerk of the City of Ottawa; THEREFORE the Council of The Corporation of the City of Ottawa enacts as follows: There is designated as being of architectural value or interest the real property, more particularly described in Schedule "A" hereto, known as 199-205 Daly Avenue. 2.
