Notice is hereby given that the Council of the Corporation of the City of Nanticoke intends to designate the properties, including the lands and buildings at the following locations, as properties of architectural and historical value under Part IV of the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1980, Chapter 337.

1.) The S.S. No. 3 Union School-Centennial Community Centre located on Main Street, Selkirk in the former Township of Walpole; the property known as the Selkirk Centennial Community Centre is a solid and imposing structure that illustrates how a building can be adapted to accommodate a new use without detracting from its exterior appearance or its architectural significance.

The Old Town Hall, Port Dover located on Main Street, Port Dover; the property known as the Old Town Hall, Port Dover is a building that manages to be both integrated in the Main Street row of buildings and at the same time to stand out as a most important structure among them. The location is the site of the old Powell Block built by Isreal W. Powell, founder of the village of Port Dover.
