

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of The Corporation of the City of North
Bay intends to designate the property, including lands and buildings,
at the following municipal address as a property of architectural and
historical value under Part IV of The Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O.
1990, C.O. 18.

Municipal Address: Part of Lots 448, 449 and 450, Part of Lots 521,
522 and 523, Registered Plan No. 21, 168 First
Avenue West, City of North Bay, owned by the
Management Board Secretariat.

REASONS FOR THE PROPOSED DESIGNATION:

The former North Bay School/Teacher's College is both architectural-
ly and historically significant.

This structure is approximately 94 years old and, therefore, one of the
oldest institutional buildings in North Bay. Construction on the former
Teacher's College building, originally named the North Bay Normal
School, was completed in 1909.

Architecturally, the building is significant for both its design and its
association with an architect of provincial renown. The Normal School
is one of four built in Ontario with the same design. F.R. Heakes, the
Provincial Government Architect of the day, was commissioned to
design the Normal Schools in 1906. The architect had been inspired
by fashionable "Edwardian" classicism and the "City Beautiful
Movement" which encouraged architects to develop monumental,
impressive designs and urban parks promoting "civic grandeur" and
pride.

Any person may, within thirty (30) days of the publication of this
notice, submit to the Clerk of the City of North Bay, notice of his or
her objection to the proposed designation together with statement of
the reasons for the objection and all relevant facts. If such a Notice of
Objection is received, the Council of The Corporation of the City of
North Bay shall refer the matter to the Conservation Review Board for
a hearing and report.
