Being a By-law to designate the Midland Public Library as a property of historical value and interest under the provisions of The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974.

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WHEREAS The Ontario Heritage Act 1974 authorizes the Council of the Municipality to enact by-laws to designate real property, including all the buildings and structures thereon, to be of historical or architectural value or interest; and

WHEREAS the reasons to designate are set forth as Schedule "A", attached.



THEREFORE, THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF MIDLAND ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:-

1. There is designated as being of historical value or interest the real property, more particularly described in Schedule "A" hereto, known as the Midland Public Library, 320 King Street, Midland, Ontario.
2. The Town Solicitor is hereby authorized to cause a copy of the said by-law to be registered against the property described in Schedule "A" hereto, in the proper Registry Office.
3. The Town Clerk is hereby authorized to cause a copy of the said By-law to be served upon The Ontario Heritage Foundation and to cause notice of this By-law to be published in the area newspapers.

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REASONS FOR THE PROPOSED DESIGNATION:

The Midland Public Library is recommended for designation as a historical site to permit it to continue to serve the community.

The building is both a major focal point in the Downtown Core and an excellent example of sound architecture and craftsmanship. Its unique four faced clock is the only public time piece within the Corporation.
