The necessary notice of the passing of this by-law is scheduled to appear in the local press on October 7th, 14th, and 21st, 1993.



THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF BELLEVILLE

BY-LAW NUMBER 13480

A BY-LAW TO DESIGNATE A CERTAIN PROPERTY WITHIN THE CITY OF BELLEVILLE TO BE OF HISTORIC OR ARCHITECTURAL VALUE OR INTEREST (CITY OF BELLEVILLE MARKET SQUARE)

WHEREAS Section 29 of the Ontario Heritage Act, 1990 provides that where the council of a municipality has given notice of its intention to designate a property to be of historic or architectural value or interest and where objections to said notice of designation are duly received and duly processed through the Conservation Review Board, the council shall pass a by-law designating the property to be of historic or architectural value or interest;

AND WHEREAS all statutory requirements for giving notice of council's intention to pass a by-law designating the property herein described to be of historic or architectural value have been complied with;

AND WHEREAS no objections to said notice of designation were received;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF BELLEVILLE ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1. THAT the City of Belleville Market Square, which parcel of land is more particularly described in SCHEDULE "A" attached hereto, be and the same is designated as a property of historic or architectural value or interest, for the reasons stated in SCHEDULE "B" attached hereto as provided for in the Ontario Heritage Act, 1990.

THIS BY-LAW SHALL COME INTO FORCE AND TAKE EFFECT IMMEDIATELY ON AND AFTER THE PASSING THEREOF.

Read a first time this 7th day of September, 1993.

Read a second time this 7th day of September, 1993.

Read a third time and finally passed this 7th day of September, 1993.

REASONS FOR THE PROPOSED DESIGNATION

CITY OF BELLEVILLE
MARKET SQUARE

SUMMARY OF HISTORICAL BACKGROUND

The Market has played a significant role in Belleville's history for almost two centuries. The original town plan in 1816 reserved land for a Market, immediately to the east of this site. In the 1840's the present site was selected for the central Market. A Market building was erected at the east end in 1849 and a much larger Market building (now known as City Hall) was erected at the west end in 1872-73. The Market Square is a visible reminder of the importance of agriculture to Belleville's growth.
