All Ma 1 IN THE MATTER OF the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1980, c. 337; AND IN THE MATTER OF the lands and premises known municipally as 315 Daly Avenue in the City of Ottawa, in the Province of Ontario. NOTICE OF DESIGNATING BY-LAW TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the City of Ottawa on the 21st day of November 1984, enacted By-law Number 299-84 designating the lands and buildings known municipally as 315 Daly Avenue as a property of architectural value or interest under the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1980, c. 337. STATEMENT OF REASONS FOR THE DESIGNATION: The building at 315 Daly Avenue is recommended for individual designation as being of architectural value. Originally built as a single residence for Duncan Graham, before 1861; the building was enlarged in 1889 and converted to a double residence. The building is a two and one-half storey stone structure with a bellcast mansard roof. The original building was three bays in width with a central entrance. The original entrance door with transom and sidelights remain. The fourth bay, on the east end, was added during the 1889 conversion. A by-law of The Corporation of the City of Ottawa to designate 315 Daly Avenue to be of architectural value or interest;

WHEREAS the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1980, c. 337, authorizes the Council of a municipality to enact by-laws to designate real property, including all the buildings and structures thereon, to be of architectural value or interest;

AND WHEREAS the Council of The Corporation of the City of Ottawa has caused to be served upon the owner of the lands and premises known as 315 Daly Avenue more particularly described in Schedule "A" hereto, and upon the Ontario Heritage Foundation, notice of intention to so designate the aforesaid real property and has caused such notice of intention to be published in the Ottawa Citizen newspaper having a general circulation in the City of Ottawa, once a week for three consecutive weeks, namely on September 29, October 6 and 13, 1984;

AND WHEREAS the reasons for the designation are set out as Schedule "B" hereto;

AND WHEREAS no notice of objection to the said proposed designation has been served upon the Clerk of the City of Ottawa;

THEREFORE the Council of The Corporation of the City of Ottawa enacts as follows:

- 1. There is designated as being of architectural value or interest the real property, more particularly described in Schedule "A" hereto, known as 315 Daly Avenue.
- 2. The City Solicitor is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be registered against the property described in Schedule "A" hereto in the proper Land Registry Office.

- The City Clerk is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be served upon the owner of the property described in Schedule "A", and upon the Ontario Heritage Foundation, and to cause notice of this by-law to be published in a newspaper having a general circulation in the City of Ottawa.
- 4. The schedules attached hereto and marked Schedule "A" and Schedule "B" form part of this by-law and all notations, references and other information contained therein shall be as much a part of this by-law as if all the matters and information set forth by the said schedules were all fully described herein.
