TOWNSHIP OF COLLINGWOOD

NOTICE

TAKE NOTICE that pursuant to the provisions of the Ontario Heritage Act R.S.O. 1980, the Corporation of the Township of Collingwood intends by by-law to designate the Craigleith. Community Centre as a building of historical or architectural interest. Said building being situated on lot 167, Plan 529 in the Township of Collingwood, County of Grey.

The Fleming Family, who had started to quarry limestone in Craigleith (Gaelic for Rocky Bay or Rock Harbour) near the water's edge, donated a "village lot" in August 1861. Apparently the last known use of the quarry was for the erection of the Craigleith School House which opened in 1864 not then completed. It operated continuously as a school until 1968 when the local children were then taken by bus to Thornbury.

When the fire damage of 1893 was repaired the Flemings no longer owned the quarry which necessitated prick rather than white limestone reconstruction.

Records were kept for the entire period of operation of the school and the building still stands and continues to provide a meeting place for local residents as is now known as the Craigleith Centre.

Any person who wishes to object to the proposed designation, shall within 30 days of the publication herein, serve on the Clerk of the Township, a Notice of Objection, setting out the objections and all relevant facts thereto.
