### BY-LAW NO. 2006-192

OF

# The Corporation of Norfolk County

BEING A BY-LAW TO DESIGNATE THE MUNRO/MOUND RESIDENCE INCLUDING LANDS AND BUILDINGS BEING PART OF LOT 14, CONCESSION 4, GEOGRAPHIC TOWNSHIP OF CHARLOTTEVILLE, NORFOLK COUNTY, MORE PARTICULARLY DESCRIBED AS PART 1 ON REFERENCE PLAN 37R-4671, MUNICIPALLY KNOWN AS 1116 CHARLOTTEVILLE ROAD 5, AS BEING OF CULTURAL HERITAGE VALUE AND INTEREST.

WHEREAS Subsection 29 of the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter O.18, authorizes the Council of a municipality to enact by-laws to designate a property within the municipality, including all buildings and structures thereof, to be of cultural heritage value and interest;

AND WHEREAS notice of intention to designate the Munroe/Mound Residence including lands and buildings, being Part Lot 14, Concession 4, Geographic Township of Charlotteville, Norfolk County, more particularly described as Part 1 on Reference Plan 37R-4671, municipally known as 1116 Charlotteville Road 5, was served on the owner of the Munroe/Mound Residence and on the Ontario Heritage Trust and such notice was published in the Simcoe Reformer, a newspaper having general circulation in the municipality;

AND WHEREAS the reasons for designation are set out in Schedule "A" hereto;

**AND WHEREAS** no notice of objection to the proposed designation has been served on the Clerk of the municipality;

# NOW THEREFORE THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF NORFOLK COUNTY HEREBY ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. The real property known as the Munro/Mound Residence including lands and buildings, being Part Lot 14, Concession 4, Geographic Township of Charlotteville, Norfolk County, more particularly described as Part 1 on Reference Plan 37R-4671, municipally known as 1116 Charlotteville Road 5 is hereby designated as being of cultural heritage value and interest;
- 2. That the Clerk is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this By-law to be registered against the property described in Schedule "A" hereto in the Land Registry Office of the Land Registry Division of Norfolk;

- 3. That the Clerk is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this By-law to be served on the owner of the property described in Schedule "A" hereto and on the Ontario Heritage Trust and to cause notice of this By-law to be published in the Simcoe Reformer.
- 4. That the effective date of this By-law shall be the date of final passage thereof.

#### SCHEDULE "A"

## REASONS FOR DESIGNATION

The Munroe/Mound residence located at 1116 Charlotteville Road 5, Part Lot 14, Concession 4, Geographic Township of Charlotteville, Norfolk County, more particularly described as Part 1 on Reference Plan 37R-4671, is recognized to be of historical significance due to the history of its owners and its architectural features.

In 1796, the Munro family was one of the earliest to arrive in the Long Point area and became significant in local history for building the first two-storey building large enough to accommodate the first Judicial and Municipal meetings of the London District, as well as to serve as a store and tavern/inn. Pioneer hardships are also evident in the untimely deaths of James Munro and the young wives of Robert and Edwin Munro.

The preservation of the 1930's addition to the house and its early-20th century link to Hollywood, adds another layer of interest to the long history of this residence.

External features of the house are reflective of American colonial traditions which the Loyalists brought with them in the 1800's.

The following features are some of the reasons for designation:

- North elevation: 6-panel entrance door, pilasters, hood mould and flanking windows. All 6/6 upper sash windows, and 6/9 lower sash windows.
- East façade, including Dutch door, dovecote and later windows.
- East wall of the Great Room in its entirety, including the inglenook, the fireplace, the flanking bench seats, paneling, mantelpiece, all paneling adjacent to the inglenook, and the balcony and railing above.

For these reasons this building warrants designation as a property of cultural heritage value and interest.
