A Notice of Objection to the designations may be served on the Clerk no later than the 18th day of January, 2007.

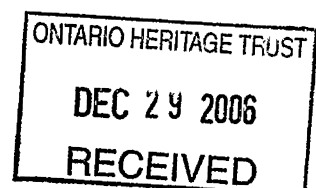

NOTICE OF INTENTION

TO DESIGNATE THE McINNES/WOTTEN RESIDENCE (MAPLELODGE) 1872

TAKE NOTICE THAT, the Council of The Corporation of Norfolk County intends to designate the property, including lands and buildings, being Lot 3, Block 19, Plan 29B, in the Geographic Township of Charlotteville, municipally known as 22 Lamport Street Vittoria, Ontario, within Norfolk County.

The property is recognized to be of historical significance due to the establishment and flourishing of the McInnes line in Norfolk County and the social history of the house. The residence is categorized as "mid-Victorian" by virtue of it being built in 1872, in a style more specifically known as the "Picturesque" style, with each façade, or elevation, having a different profile from the others, due to indentations and projections in the floor plan.
