NOTICE OF INTENTION

TO DESIGNATE THE SOUTH WALSINGHAM TOWNSHIP HALL 2070 MAIN STREET, WALSINGHAM, ON

TAKE NOTICE THAT, the Council of The Corporation of Norfolk County intends to Pass a By-Law pursuant to the provisions of the Ontario Heritage Act, to designate the South Walsingham Township Hall on the property legally described as Lot 5, Block 2, Plan 31B, in the Geographic Township of South Walsingham, municipally known as 2070 Main Street, Walsingham, ON, within Norfolk County, as being of cultural heritage value or interest.

The South Walsingham Township Hall, circa 1863, a well-preserved example of Classical Revival architecture, has survived from the mid-nineteenth century to the present relatively unchanged through the collective efforts of so many from the surrounding community. In return, the building has played a significant role at the centre of community activities. For these reasons, this building warrants designation as a property of historical, cultural and architectural importance to the rural community of South Walsingham and protection under the Ontario Heritage Act. The following building features are specifically noted for their architectural significance:

Exterior:

- All four elevations including doorways, and
- All windows including transom and arched window, and
- The roof line

Interior:

- Original wooden benches, and
- Original wainscoting, and
- Original wood floor boards in the front entranceway, and
- Original stage area

Any person who objects to the proposed designation may serve on the Clerk of Norfolk County not later than the 28th day of November, 2014 a notice of objection setting out the reason for objection and all relevant facts.
