Please be advised that the Council of The Corporation of Norfolk County intends to designate the following two buildings within Norfolk County under the Ontario Heritage Act:

1. S.S. No. 11 Teeterville/Teeterville Women's Institute Building, 194 Teeter Street, Teeterville, Ontario.
2. Port Dover Lighthouse, end of the West Pier at entrance to Port Dover Harbour, Port Dover, Ontario.

NOTICE OF INTENTION

TO DESIGNATE THE PORT DOVER LIGHTHOUSE LOCATED AT END OF WEST PIER, PORT DOVER, ONTARIO



TAKE NOTICE THAT the Council of The Corporation of Norfolk County intends to pass a By-Law pursuant to the provisions of the Ontario Heritage Act to designate the Port Dover Lighthouse, located at the end of the west pier at the entrance to Port Dover Harbour, as being of cultural heritage value or interest. The proposed designation is confined to the lighthouse building.

The Port Dover Lighthouse is recognized to be of historical, cultural and architectural significance to the community of Port Dover as it remains a good example of a building associated with the establishment of navigational aids on the Great Lakes in the nineteenth century, being a symbol of the maritime community and having played an important role in its economy.

The following features of the Lighthouse are specifically noted for their heritage significance and warrant protection under the Ontario Heritage Act:

- The simple design and profile of the square, heritage colours, tapered tower with its square lantern, platform, gallery handrail and pediment
- The placement of any openings
- The interior wood frame construction

Further information respecting the proposed designation is available at the Clerk's Office, Norfolk County Administration Building, 50 Colborne Street South, Simcoe.

Any person who objects to the proposed designation may serve on the Clerk of Norfolk County not later than the 8th day of April, 2016 a notice of objection setting out the reason for objection and all relevant facts.
