IN THE MATTER OF The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, Statutes of Ontario, 1974, Chapter 122, and IN THE MATTER OF the lands and premises known as St. Patrick's Church, Kent Street, more particularly described as parts of Lots 22, 23, 24, 25, and 26 Nepean Street north, and parts of Lots 22, 23, 24, 25 and 26 Gloucester Street south, Plan 2996 and the rectory at 281 Nepean Street, in the City of Ottawa, in the Province of Ontario.

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of The Corporation of the City of Ottawa on the 19th day of October, 1977, decided to designate the lands and buildings known as St. Patrick's Church, Kent Street, more particularly described as parts of Lots 22, 23, 24, 25 and 26 Nepean Street north, and parts of Lots 22, 23, 24, 25 and 26 Gloucester Street south, Plan 2996 and the rectory at 281 Nepean Street, as a property of architectural and historical value or interest under The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, Statutes of Ontario, 1974, Chapter 122.

SHORT STATEMENT OF REASON FOR THE PROPOSED DESIGNATION

"St. Patrick's Roman Catholic Church at Kent and Nepean Streets, including its rectory at 281 Nepean Street, is recommended for designation as being of historical and architectural value. The first church built by Ottawa's English-speaking Catholics, St. Patrick's was erected 1869-73, initially from plans prepared by Augustus Laver, of the firm of Fuller and Laver. The design was completed by King Arnoldi, prominent Ottawa architect. This building was frequently improved and enlarged during the remainder of the nineteenth century. The stone Gothic Revival design is typically fairly restrained on the exterior. It is dominated by a prominent central tower and spire, reaching a height of 198 feet. The rectory was erected in 1883 and has subsequently been considerably altered."

NOTICE OF OBJECTION to the designation may be served on the Clerk, within thirty days of the 21st day of February, 1978.
