TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Bracebridge intends to designate the property including lands and buildings, known municipally as 94 Manitoba Street, as a property of architectural and/or historical value or interest under Part IV of The Ontario Heritage, 1980, R.S.O. Chapter 337.

Reasons for proposed Designation

The Bracebridge Town Library located at 94 Manitoba Street, is recommended for designation for architectural reasons as an example of neo-Classical design with Romanesque accents. The interior is Greek Revival-Ionic, and the .-. building itself is constructed from Muskoka stone.

Historically the building has served as a focal point for activities and as a civic symbol since 1906, and generally epitomizes and reflects the nature of the surrounding district.

The Town Library is a prominent structure on a high point in the town at the intersection of Manitoba Street and Dominion Street, and its retention is important for preserving the character of the surrounding area.

ANY PERSON MAY, before the 21st of September, 1982, send by registered mail or deliver to the Clerk of The Corporation of the Town of Bracebridge, notice of his or her objection to the proposed designation, together with a statement of the reasons for the objection and all relevant facts. When a notice of objection has been received, the Council of the Town of Bracebridge will refer the matter to the Conservation Review Board for a hearing and report.
