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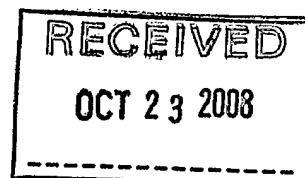

PUBLIC NOTICE

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO REPEAL HERITAGE DESIGNATION

The Municipality of Clarington intends to repeal By-law 92-81 which designated 27 King Street West, Bowmanville, Ontario as a property of architectural and historical value under Part IV of the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter O.18.

This property sustained severe damage due to a fire on April 29, 2008, and on April 30, 2008, an Emergency Order was issued by the Chief Building Official requiring that the building be demolished immediately as it was considered unsafe and a public hazard.

Any person may send by Registered Mail or deliver to the Municipal Clerk of the Municipality of Clarington, notice of his or her objection to the proposed repealing by-law, together with a statement of the reasons for the objection and all relevant facts. If such a notice of objection is received by November 28, 2008, the Council of the Municipality of Clarington shall refer the matter to the Conservation Review Board for a hearing.
