NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of The Corporation of
the City of Ottawa on the 7th day of September, 1977, decided
to designate the lands and buildings known as St. Anne's
Church/Eglise Sainte Anne, St. Patrick Street, more particu-
larly described as part of Lots 21 and 22, St. Patrick Street
south and part of Lots 3 and 4, Myrand Avenue north, as a
property of architectural and historical value or interest
under The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, Statutes of Ontario,
1974, Chapter 122.

SHORT STATEMENT OF REASON FOR THE PROPOSED DESIGNATION:

"St. Anne's Church/Eglise Sainte Anne,
St. Patrick Street, is recommended for desig-
nation as being of architectural and historical
value. Erected in 1873, this Roman Catholic
church was designed by the architect J.-P.
Lecourt. French-Canadian in character, the
church has a notably flat front facade, crowned
by an attractive spire. St. Anne's was enlarged
prior to 1895 with the addition of transepts
and a chancel area."

NOTICE OF OBJECTION to the designation may be served
on the Clerk, within thirty days of the 21st day of February,
1978.
