NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of The Corporation of
the City of Ottawa on the 7th day of September, 1977, decided
to designate the lands and buildings known as St. Andrew's
Church, Wellington Street, more particularly described as parts
of Lots 3 and 4, Wellington Street south, and parts of Lots 3
and 4, Sparks Street north, Plan 3922, as a property of archi-
tectural and historical value or interest under The Ontario
Heritage Act, 1974, Statutes of Ontario, 1974, Chapter 122.

SHORT STATEMENT OF REASON FOR THE PROPOSED DESIGNATION:

"The church building of St. Andrew's
Presbyterian Church (1872-74) is recommended
for designation as being of historical and
architectural value. The church hall to the
rear is not to be included. St. Andrew's is
the oldest Protestant Congregation in the City
of Ottawa, having been first established in
1828. The present structure is representative
of this heritage and of the prominent role of
many members in affairs of the City and of the
Nation. Designed by W. T. Thomas of Montreal,
the church is also a good example of the Victorian
Gothic ecclesiastical architecture of Canada,
with its relative severity of style and flat
surfaces. St. Andrew's maintains the character
of the nineteenth century in the heart of the
contemporary urban core of the Nation's Capital."

NOTICE OF OBJECTION to the designation may be served
on the Clerk, within thirty (30) day of the 21st day of
February 1978.
