By-law No. 476-77 - to designate the "Hammond House" at 2625 Hammond Road

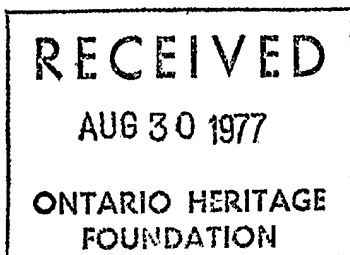
477-77 - to designate The Lewis Bradley Pioneer Museum on the south side of Orr Road, west of Meadow Wood Road

479-77 - to designate the "Ball House" on the south side of Derry Road West, east of Second Line East in the Village of Meadowvale


492-77 - to designate the "Rowe House" at 117 Queen Street North

BY-LAW NUMBER. 476:77

To designate the "Hammond House" at 2625 Hammond Road of architectural value and of historic interest.

WHEREAS The Ontario Heritage Act, S.O. 1974, Chapter 122, Section 29 (6), authorizes the council of a municipality to enact by-laws to designate real property including all the buildings and structures thereon, to be of historic or architectural value or interest; and

WHEREAS notice of intention to so designate the "Hammond House" at 2625 Hammond Road having been duly published and served and no notice of objection to such designation having been received by the Council of The Corporation of the City of Mississauga.

WHEREAS the reasons for the said designation are set out as Schedule 'A' hereto;

THEREFORE the Council of The Corporation of the City of Mississauga enacts as follows:

1. That the real property, more particularly described in Schedule 'B' hereto, known as the "Hammond House" at 2625 Hammond Road be designated as being of architectural and historic value or interest.
2. That the City Clerk is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be served upon the owner of the aforesaid property and upon the Ontario Heritage Foundation and to cause notice of this by-law to be published in a newspaper having general circulation in the City of Mississauga.



SCHEDULE "A"

Reasons for the designation of the "Hammond House" at 2625
Hammond Road.

The "Hammond House" is recommended for designation on the architectural grounds that it is a good example of the early Italianate style of architecture with its ornately bracketed eaves, stone quoins and round-headed windows. It is believed to have been build in 1866 by Captain Thomas Hammond, one of Erindale's early farmers.

SCHEDULE 'B'

ALL AND SINGULAR that certain parcel or tract of land and premises situate, lying and being in the City of Mississauga, Regional Municipality of Peel (formerly in the Town of Mississauga, County of Peel), Province of Ontario, and being composed of Part 3 on a reference plan deposited in the Land Registry Office for the Registry Division of Peel (No. 43) as 43R-3594.
