NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Cobalt intends to designate the property, including lands and buildings, at the following municipal address as a property of architectural and/or historical value or interest under Part IV of the Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, S.O. Chapter 122.

Municipal Address: 7 Prospect Avenue, Cobalt. Ontario.

Reasons for the Proposed Designation:

The Bank of Ottawa building is recommended for designation for architectural reasons. Constructed in 1913, this charming two storey structure is built in a Medeival style unique in the Town of Cobalt. The Medeival motif is carried out on the pressed brick facade with the use of a concrete "dressed stone" base, quoined "stone" edging around the windows and door, a ground floor window under a segmentally arched "stone" heading, a crenellated drip stone and side scrolled transom light over the door, a centred second floor quintuple window topped with a continuous "stone" heading band, and a bracketed "dressed stone" cornice. This building presents a unique architectural facet of the first decade of the Town of Cobalt.
