## NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE

IN THE MATTER OF THE ONTARIO HERITAGE ACT, R.S.O. 1990 CHAPTER O.18 as amended and in the matter of the property known as the BARCLAY HOUSE located at 7335 Yonge Street, being North Part of Lot 16, Plan 1167, Concession 7 in the Town of Innisfil, County of Simcoe, in the Province of Ontario, TAKE NOTICE that the Council for The Corporation of the Town of Innisfil intends to designate BARCLAY HOUSE under Part IV of The Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1990, c.O.18, as amended.

### Statement of Cultural Heritage Value or Interest

The Barclay House, a landmark on the south east corner of Barclay on Hwy 11 (Yonge Street) and the 8th line of Innisfil was built circa 1870 by Francis Barclay and family, pioneer settlers from Dumfriesshire, Scotland who arrived in Innisfil in 1849. The Barclay's soon became prominent members of the community and were noted for their community, business and prize-winning agricultural endeavors.

Francis' son George became a magistrate and postmaster in Innisfil and carried the mail from Stroud to the Barclay house for thirty years.

### Description of Heritage Attributes

Key exterior attributes that embodied the heritage value of the Barclay House as one of the last examples of a fieldstone farmhouse that remained in the Town of Innisfil include:

- 1 ½ story solid fieldstone house
- 3 bay front with end gables and end chimneys
- Cut stone façade and rubble stone construction
- Six over six window sashes
- Front entrance with transom and side lights
