TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the Town
of Cobalt intends to designate the property,
including lands and buildings, at the following municipal address
as a property of architectural and/or historical value or interest
under Part IV of the Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, S.O. Chapter 122.

Municipal Address: 10 Lang Street, Cobalt, Ontario.

Reasons for the Proposed Designation:

The Silver City Drug Store is recommended for designation for architectural and historical reasons. Built in 1905-1906, it is one of the earliest retail structures in town and has an important place in the row of stores along Lang Street., all of which date from 1913 or before. This streetscape, of which the Silver City Drug Store is an integral part, presents a unique cross-section of the retail structure of Cobalt's first decade. Although small in size, this building has contained many of the service industries necessary to a mining town, including G.H. Moore's Silver City Drug Store, H. J. Deyell's assay office, Laird's barber shop, a shoemaker, Victor Barber's jewellery store, and MacKay's tailor shop. Much of the building has been restored with non-original but contemporary elements or even new materials; however, the general effect is of the correct historic period. The retention of this early and colourful building is important to the preservation of the character of Lang Street.

Notice of objection to the proposed designation, together with a statement of the reasons for the objection and all relevant facts may be served on the Clerk of the Town of Cobalt before the 26th. day of October, 19 78.
