TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the Town  
of COBALT intends to designate the property,  
including lands and buildings, at the following municipal address  
as a property of architectural and/or historical value or interest  
under Part IV of the Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, S.O. Chapter 122.

Municipal Address: 34 Cobalt Street, Cobalt. Ontario.

Reasons for the Proposed Designation:

The Presbyterian Manse is recommended for designation for architectural reasons. Built in 1907 by the Presbyterian congregation for their minister, J.D. Byrens, it is one of the most handsome of the very few original residences that have survived in Cobalt. The Manse is designed in an angular variation of the Queen Anne Style, as characterized by the somewhat irregular plan, cross gable roof, shingled gables, diamond paned window, peaked dormer, second floor bay window, first floor inset corner bay, and spacious wooden verandah and gallery with the many sticklike balusters. It appears to be the only example of this style in the Town of Cobalt and has survived with almost no alterations.

Notice of objection to the proposed designation, together with a statement of the reasons for the objection and all relevant facts may be served on the Clerk of the Town of Cobalt before the 26th. day of October, 19 78.
