has passed By-Law No. 68-89 to designate the following property as being
of architectural and historical value or interest under Part IV of The
Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1980, Chapter 337:

- A. LOCATION: NORWICH MUSEUM, (former Society of Friends {Quakers}
Meeting House), Part Lot 8, Concession 4, former Township of
North Norwich

REASON FOR DESIGNATION:

This building was erected in 1889 by the Orthodox Friends
(Quakers) who placed importance upon "plainness of speech,
behaviour and apparel".

It was the seventh Quaker meeting house to be erected in the
Township of Norwich and the only one now standing in a largely
unaltered form.

The Quaker theme of simplicity is much evident in the
architectural styling of the building.

Locally produced white clay brick was used in construction. The
broad gable over the main entrance vestibule is outlined in
stepped brick work and there is a dentate design under the eaves
on the sides of the building.

Five simulated pillars on each side of the structure frame four
plain double-hung windows.

The roof of the main building and the vestibule is of plain slate.

A double two-panelled door with a rectangular two-paned transom
gives entry to the vestibule which also features a side door to
the south.

BEING A BY-LAW TO DESIGNATE THE
PROPERTY KNOWN MUNICIPALLY AS
THE NORWICH MUSEUM,
PART LOT 8, CONCESSION 4,
FORMER TOWNSHIP OF NORTH NORWICH
AS BEING OF ARCHITECTURAL
AND HISTORICAL VALUE OR INTEREST.

WHEREAS, SECTION 29 of The Ontario Heritage Act, 1980, authorizes the council of a municipality to enact by-laws to designate real property, including all buildings and structures thereon, to be of architectural or historic value or interest;

AND WHEREAS, the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Norwich has caused to be served on the owners of the lands and premises known as THE NORWICH MUSEUM, Part Lot 8, Concession 4, former Township of North Norwich, and upon the Ontario Heritage Foundation, notice of intention to so designate the aforesaid real property and has caused such notice of intention to be published in the same newspaper having general circulation in the municipality once for each of three consecutive weeks;

AND WHEREAS, no notice of objection to the proposed designation has been served on the Clerk of the Municipality;

THEREFORE, the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Norwich enacts as follows:

1. There is designated as being of architectural and historical value or interest the real property known as The Norwich Museum, Part Lot 8, Concession 4, former Township of North Norwich, more particularly described in SCHEDULE A, hereto attached.
2. The Municipal Solicitor is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be registered against the property described in Schedule A hereto in the proper land registry office.
3. The Clerk is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be served on the owner of the aforesaid property and on the Ontario Heritage Foundation and to cause notice of the passing of this by-law to be published in the same newspaper having general circulation in the municipality once for each of three consecutive weeks.

SCHEDULE "A"

TO

BY-LAW NO. 68-89

DESCRIPTION

In the Township of Norwich, formerly the Township of North Norwich, in the County of Oxford and being composed of parts of Lot 8, Concession 4, of the said Township described as follows:

FIRSTLY: Part of the north half of Lot 8 in the 4th Concession, of the said Township of Norwich, more particularly described as follows:

PREMISING that the easterly boundary of said Lot 8, Concession 4, has a bearing of South 11 degrees 30 minutes east and relating all bearings herein thereto;

COMMENCING at the south east angle of the north half of said Lot;

THENCE South 78 degrees 30 minutes West a distance of 351.12 feet to a point in the easterly boundary of Washington Street in the Village of Norwich;

THENCE North 11 degrees 30 minutes west a distance of 124.08 feet;

THENCE North 78 degrees 30 minutes east a distance of 351.12 feet to the easterly boundary of said Lot;

THENCE South 11 degrees 30 minutes east a distance of 124.08 feet more or less to the place of commencement, as described in instrument number A93361.

SECONDLY: That part of Lot 8 in the 4th Concession of the said Township of Norwich, described as follows:

PREMISING that bearings herein are related to the western limit of the King's Highway No. 59, as shown on Registered Plan No. 448A, which has an astronomic bearing of North 17 degrees 02 minutes West according to the said Registered Plan;

BEGINNING at a point in the western limit of the said King's Highway No. 59, according to Registered Plan No. 448A, distant 124.08 feet northerly from its intersection with the line between the North and South halves of the said lot;

THENCE South 78 degrees 18 minutes West parallel to this last mentioned line 100.00 feet to the point of commencement at the south-east angle of the parcel herein described;

THENCE North 12 degrees 02 minutes West, 50.00 feet;

THENCE South 78 degrees 18 minutes West parallel to the line between the North and South halves of the said lot, 256.39 feet to a fence;

THENCE South 12 degrees 07 minutes East along the said fence, 50.00 feet;

THENCE North 78 degrees 18 minutes East, 256.34 feet more or less to the point of commencement, as described in instrument number B30504.

THIRDLY: COMMENCING to measure from the Highway Monument marking the south-east angle of the north-east quarter of the said Lot 8 northerly along the easterly limit of the said Lot 8 a distance of 124.74 feet to a point being the place of beginning.

THENCE Northerly along the Easterly limit of said Lot 8 a distance of 100 feet;

THENCE Westerly parallel with the centre line of the said Lot a distance of 100 feet;

THENCE Southerly parallel with the Easterly limit of the said Lot 8 a distance of 100 feet;

THENCE Easterly parallel with the centre line of the said Lot 8 a distance of 100 feet more or less to the place of beginning.
