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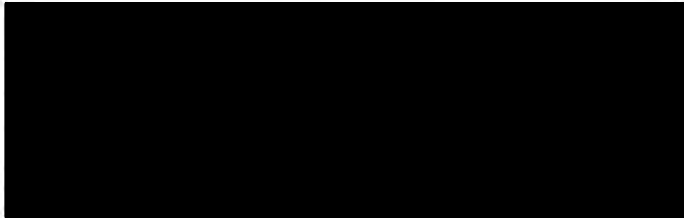

BY-LAW NUMBER 10-88

OF THE

2) TOWNSHIP OF NORTH EASTHOPE

BEING a By-law to designate the property known municipally as the Brocksden School property, part lot 33 & 34, concession 2 as being of architectural value or interest.

WHEREAS Section 29 of the Ontario Heritage Act, 1974 authorizes the Council of a municipality to enact by-laws to designate real property, including all buildings and structures thereon, to be of architectural value or interest; and

WHEREAS the Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Easthope has caused to be served upon the owners of the lands and premises known municipally as part lot 33 and 34, concession 2, and upon The Ontario Heritage Foundation, notice of intention to so designate the aforesaid real property and has caused such notice of intention to be published in the same newspaper having general circulation in the municipality; and

WHEREAS no notice of objection to the proposed designation has been served on the Clerk of the municipality;

THEREFORE the Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Easthope ENACTS AS FOLLOWS;

- 1) There is designated as being of architectural value or interest the real property known municipally as the Brocksden School property, part lot 33 and 34, concession 2 more particularly described in Schedule "A" hereto.
- 2) The Municipal Solicitor is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be registered against the properties described in Schedule "A" hereto in the proper land registry office.
- 3) The Clerk is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be served on the Ontario Heritage Foundation and to cause notice or the passing of this by-law to be published in the same newspaper having general circulation in the municipality.

SCHEDULE A

BROCKSDEN SCHOOL, PART LOT 33,
AND 34, CONCESSION 2

Reasons for Designation:

5) Brocksden School is the oldest surviving schoolhouse in Perth County. It was erected in 1853 and was in continuous operation until 1967. This designation would cover the exterior and details, and the interior now altered.
