BY-LAW # 37-1985

A by-law to designate the property known municipally as pt lot 12, pt lot 13, conc 1, and pt lot 13, conc 2, R.P. 44R407, pt 1, as being of architectural and historical value and interest.

Whereas section 29 of the Ontario Heritage Act, authorizes the Council of a municipality to enact by-laws to designate real property, including all buildings and structures thereon, to be of architectural or historical value or interest; and,

Whereas the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Blanshard has caused to be served on the owners of the premises known as pt lot 12, pt lot 13, conc 1, pt lot 13, conc 2, R.P. 44R407, at R. R. 1, St. Marys, Ontario, and upon the Ontario Heritage Foundation, notice of intention to so designate the aforesaid real property and has caused such notice of intention to be published in the same newspaper having general circulation in the municipality once for each of three consecutive weeks; and

Whereas no notice of objection to the proposed designation has been served on the Clerk of the municipality;

Therefore the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Blanshard enacts as follows;

1. There is designated as being of architectural and historical value and interest the real property known as pt lot 12, pt lot 13, conc 1, and pt lot 13, conc 2, R.P. 44R407, pt 1, at R. R. 1, St. Marys.
2. The Clerk is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be registered against the property described in Schedule "A" attached hereto in the proper land registry office.
3. The Clerk is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be served on the owner of the aforesaid property and on the Ontario Heritage Foundation and to cause notice of the passing of this by-law to be published in the same newspaper having general circulation in the municipality once for each of three consecutive weeks.
4. By-law # 28-1980 (which although passed was never executed in behalf of the Corporation of the Municipality of Blanshard) being a by-law to designate the Meighen House as described above as being of Architectural and Historical value and interest is hereby repealed.

ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION  
MEIGHEN HOMESTEAD

The Meighen homestead is a solidly built storey and a half fieldstone farmhouse showing an Irish influence, common at the time of construction in the 1840's. The interior specifications are not of great concern at present since the deterioration and subsequent renovations preclude any interior preservation. The frame addition, c. 1860-70 indicates an architectural influence from the Victorian school.
