

BY-LAW NO. 94-91

A By-law to Repeal By-law No. 43-89
(Being a By-law to Designate Property Known Municipally
as 9480 Leslie Street, Richmond Hill
under the Ontario Heritage Act)
(The Headford School)

WHEREAS Section 32 of the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1980, authorizes the Council of a municipality to enact a by-law to repeal a by-law designating property under that Act upon application from the subject property owner;

AND WHEREAS the owner of the property known municipally as 9480 Leslie Street, Richmond Hill has applied to have the designation of building situated thereon under the Ontario Heritage Act repealed, citing the destruction of the said building by fire August 15, 1990;

**NOW THEREFORE THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF
THE TOWN OF RICHMOND HILL ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:**

1. That By-law No. 43-89 is hereby repealed.
2. That the Clerk is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this By-law to be served on the owner of the aforesaid property and on the Ontario Heritage Foundation and to cause notice of the passing of this By-law to be published in a newspaper having general circulation in the municipality.
3. The Town Solicitor is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this By-law to be registered against the property described in Schedule 'A' attached hereto in the Land Registry Office.
4. Schedule 'A' attached hereto shall form part of this By-law.

SCHEDULE "A" TO BY-LAW NO. 94-91

ALL AND SINGULAR that certain parcel or tract of land and premises situate lying and being in the Town of Markham, in the Regional Municipality of York (formerly the Township of Markham, in the County of York), being composed of part of Lot 17, in the Second Concession in the said Town of Markham, which parcel of land may be more particularly described as follows:

COMMENCING at a point in the easterly limit of the said Lot 17 distant 678 feet 10 inches measured northerly thereon from the south-easterly angle of the said Lot 17;

THENCE NORTH 9 degrees 0 minutes West along the easterly limit of the said Lot 17 a distance of 137 feet to that point where the said limit is intersected by the line of the old fence forming the northerly boundary of the herein described lands.

THENCE SOUTH 74 degrees 45 minutes West along the line of the said fence a distance of 159 feet to the end of the said fence;

THENCE SOUTH 74 degrees 24 minutes West a distance of 120 feet to an iron pipe planted;

THENCE SOUTH 9 degrees 11 minutes East a distance of 140 feet 11 inches to an iron pipe planted in the fence line forming the north limit of a lane;

THENCE NORTH 73 degrees 48 minutes East a distance of 279 feet more or less to the POINT OF COMMENCEMENT.
