NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE

TO: Ontario Heritage Foundation, 77 Bloor Street West, Toronto, Ontario. M7A 2R9

TAKE NOTICE THAT the Council of The Corporation of the Town of Richmond Hill intends to designate the property, including land and building, known municipally as 11575 Yonge Street, Richmond Hill as a property of architectural and/or historical value or interest under Part IV of The Ontario Heritage Act R.S.O. 1980, Chapter 337,

"The Old Jefferson School House" 11575 Yonge Street, Richmond Hill

The building is recommended for designation on architectural and historical grounds. The building known as the Old Jefferson Public School is the last known "little red schoolhouse" remaining in Richmond Hill that is unaltered in its external form.

The structure, entrance porch and facade are some of the important features of its architectural style. Historically, the school was used continuously from 1868 to 1951 when it became too small to accommodate the growing student population.

Notice of objection to the proposed designation together with a statement of the reasons for the objection and all relevant facts may be served on the Clerk of the Town of Richmond Hill before the 14th day of May, 1982.
