NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE

1. The Council of the Corporation of the Village of Bath intends to pass by-laws to designate the following properties to be of architectural and historic value or interest, pursuant to Section 29 of The Ontario Heritage Act:
 - a) 369 Main Street- W. H. Davy Store -Con.1 part lot 10, RP 29R 1026 Part 1-
This is an early two storey, limestone building with a history of combined commercial/residential use.
 - b) 353 Main Street- Ham House -Con.1 part lot 10
This building, circa 1825, is a two storey, neo classical wood frame house.

For further information, these buildings are referred to as #31 and #50 respectively, in "HISTORY AND ARCHITECTURE, VILLAGE OF BATH, ONTARIO", which is a study undertaken for heritage preservation proposed under the Ontario Heritage Act of 1974, by The School of Urban and Regional Planning, Queen's University in Kingston, Ontario. This publication can be viewed at, or purchased from, the Municipal Office, 352 Academy Street, Bath, Ontario, during regular office hours.

2. Any person interested may, within thirty (30) days after the date of this notice, send by registered mail or deliver to the Clerk of the Corporation of the Village of Bath, notice of his or her objection to the proposed designations, together with a statement of the reasons for the objection and all relevant facts.
3. Where a notice of objection has been received, the Council of the Corporation of the Village of Bath shall refer the matter to the Conservation Review Board for a hearing and report.
