NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Petrolia intends to designate the property, including lands and buildings, at the following municipal address as a property of architectural and historical value or interest under Part IV of the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1980, Chapter 337.

Reasons for Proposed Designation

Historical Reasons:

This property was obtained by Patrick Barclay in 1873 from Judge Donald McDonald. Mr. Barclay served for many years as justice of the peace and probably this connection of the two men brought about the property ownership. Mr. Barclay served on council for many years, treasurer for thirty years, as well as postmaster and bookseller. He was one of the four men who named Petrolia in 1861 as well as one of the founders of the Presbyterian Church in Town. He was one of the first oil producers in this section and continued this all his life. He was known to almost every resident and was universally esteemed throughout his busy life. He made the path much easier for those who followed. Mr. Barclay sold the home in 1880 to Ann Jane Lambert.

Architectural Reasons:

The original woodwork - ceiling, doors, wainscotting, hardwood floor have been retained over the years.

Any persons may before the 22nd day of January, 1999, send by registered mail or deliver to the Administrator Clerk of the Town of Petrolia, notice of his or her objection to the proposed designation, together with a statement of the reasons for the objection and all relevant facts. When a Notice of Objection has been received, the Council of the Town of Petrolia will refer the matter to the Conservation Review Board for a hearing and report
