
NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Petrolia intends to designate the property including lands and buildings, at the following Municipal address as a property of architectural and historical value or interest under Part IV of the Ontario Heritage Act 1990, Section 29 (1) Chapter O.18.

Prior to 1988, this house was owned by the Diocese of Huron. Attached is a list of occupants beginning with Rev. Canon William Craig whose signature is seen on the attached mortgage. Originally built as the Rectory of Christ Anglican Church.

Architectural Reasons:

440 Emmeline Street illustrates the Victorial Italinate style. In keeping with putting the best features to the most visible parts of the home, the Emma Street side features 3 beautiful round-headed windows while the Emmeline Street side has a lovely restored leaded glass over the large parlour window and another elliptical-shaped window in the front study. The north side of the house has slightly curved windows while the rear of the house has only plain rectangles. The home is triple brick. The veranda wraps around the northwest corner of the house and has an upper railing. The interior oak staircase rises from the first floor to the third floor.

Any persons may before the 17th day of April, 2009 send by registered mail or deliver to the Clerk/Administrator of the Town of Petrolia, notice of his or her objection to the proposed designation, together with a statement of the reasons for the objection and all relevant facts. When a Notice of Objection has been received, the Council of the Town of Petrolia will refer the matter to the Conservation Review Board for a hearing and report.
