

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the City of Sarnia intends to designate the property, including lands and structures, at the following municipal address as property of architectural and/or historical value or interest under PART IV of The Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1990, c.0.18, as amended.

PROPERTY:

197 MARIA STREET

REASONS FOR PROPOSED DESIGNATION:

The dwelling recommended for designation as it is a good example of a clapboard construction, which has Greek revival influences. Further, the pine front door is original and the 72 pain widow on the east side of the dwelling is unique. Finally the dwelling has historical significance as it was constructed by George Proctor, a former city mayor and was the home of the Rennie family, for three generations. David Rennie was President of the King Milling Company and his son John was became Vice-President. Research traces the dwelling to 1884.

NOTE:

Any person may, within thirty days of the publication of this Notice, send by registered mail or deliver to the Clerk of the City of Sarnia, notice of his or her objection to the proposed designation, together with a statement of reason for the objection and relevant facts. If such Notice of Objection is received, the Council of the Corporation of the City of Sarnia shall refer the matter to the Conservation Review Board for hearing.
