## BY-LAW NUMBER 111 OF 1994 OF THE CITY OF SARNIA

1. . . . T

"A By-law to Designate the structure known municipally as the Granite Marker at the west end of Devine Street, Sarnia, Ontario, as being of Historic or Architectural Value or Interest"

WHEREAS Section 29 of the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1990, c. 0.18, authorizes the Council of a municipality to enact By-laws to designate real property, including all the buildings and structures thereon, to be of historic or architectural value or interest;

AND WHEREAS the Municipal Council of The Corporation of the City of Sarnia has caused to be served on the owners of the Granite Marker at the west end of Devine Street, Sarnia, Ontario, and upon the Ontario Heritage Foundation, notice of intention to designate the aforesaid Granite Marker and has caused such notice of intention to be published in a newspaper having a general circulation in the municipality once for each of three consecutive weeks;

AND WHEREAS the reasons for designation are set out in Schedule "B" hereto;

AND WHEREAS no notice of objection to the proposed designation has been served on the Clerk of the Municipality.

NOW THEREFORE the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the City of Sarnia enacts as follows:

- There is designated as being of historic or architectural value or interest the real property more particularly described in Schedule "A" hereto, and known as the Granite Marker.
- 2. The City Solicitor is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this By-law to be registered in the proper Land Registry Office against the lands described in Schedule "A" hereto, which are the lands affected by this By-law.
- 3. The City Clerk is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this By-law to be served upon the owner of the aforesaid property and on the Ontario Heritage

Foundation and to cause notice of this By-law to be published for each of three consecutive weeks in a newspaper having general circulation in the City of Sarnia.

This By-law comes into force and effect upon being finally passed.

## SCHEDULE "A"

## DESCRIPTION:

The Granite Marker situated on the Devine Street Road Allowance, which Marker can be more particularly located as follows:

In the City of Sarnia, in the County of Lambton, and Premising that the south limit of Lot 7, Block 1, Registered Plan 16<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> (SA) has a bearing of N 88° 57' 30" W;

COMMENCING at the Southwest angle of Lot 7, Block 1, Registered Plan 161/2 (SA);

THENCE S 64° 45' 20" W 113.32 feet to a point;

THENCE S 63° 22' 45" W 72.4 feet to a point;

THENCE S 18° 38' E 10.8 feet to the said granite marker.

The Granite Marker is recommended for designation for historical reasons. Installed in 1932 by the United Church of Canada, it denotes the site of the first church/school/mission building in Lambton County.
