TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Town of Whitby intends to designate the structure at the following municipal address as a structure of architectural and historical value and interest under Part IV of the Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, S.O. Chapter 122:

Station Gallery  
1483 Henry Street  
Whitby, Ontario

The Station Gallery is an important landmark both historically and architecturally. Since its construction in 1903, it has performed two valuable functions in the Whitby community.

First, it served as a Grand Trunk Railway and later Canadian National Railway station and then, after removal to its present site in 1970, as the Town's art centre.

The low, turreted structure is constructed of wood and is a fine example of what has been termed the 'Railroad Style', exemplifying an acceptance of the rational and picturesque system of High Victorian design.

The waiting room, now exhibition space, displays fine woodwork in the form of wainscotting, columns, arches, and decorative trim.

Any person may, before October 16, 1980, send by registered mail or deliver to the Clerk-Administrator of the Town of Whitby, notice of his or her objection to the proposed designation together with a statement of reasons for objection. If such objection is received, Council shall refer the matter to the Conservation Review Board for a hearing.
