NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the TOWN of WHITBY intends to designate the property, including lands and buildings, at the following municipal address as property of architectural value or interest under Part IV of the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O., 1980, Chapter 337.

- (a) Ringwood
 1601 Hopkins Street
 Whitby, Ontario
 The composite style of Ringwood reflects trends in Canadian
 Architecture of the 19th Century resulting in a fine blend of
 Regency, Italianate and Second Empire stylings. The house also
 displays woodwork which reflects local stylings of that era.
- (b) Ringwood was built by Barnabas Gibson, a prominent railroad contractor. Gibson built the Port Whitby Lindsay line, the third Union Station in Toronto, as well as miles of railway track throughout Ontario and Quebec.

Any person may, before January 29, 1982, send by registered mail or deliver to the Clerk of the TOWN of WHITBY notice of his or her objection to the proposed designation together with a statement of reasons for the objection and all relevant facts. If such a Notice of Objection is received, the Council of the Corporation of the TOWN of WHITBY shall refer the matter to the Conservation Review Board for a hearing.
