

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Whitby intends to designate the property, including lands and buildings, at the following municipal address as property of architectural value or interest under Part IV of The Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O., 1980, Chapter 337.

Whitby, Ontario

REASONS FOR DESIGNATION

(a) Architectural

The Hood/Hare House is an excellent example of the vernacular Gothic revival style of architecture. The most outstanding feature of this white clap-board house is the finely detailed bargeboard and treillage work which surrounds the house. Also of interest are the transom and sidelights of leaded glass which surround the front door.

(b) Historical

The Hood/Hare House has had a number of owners since it was build in 1875, the most prominent of whom are Mr. William Hood who had the house built, Mrs. Florence Metcalfe and Mrs. Kathleen Hare.

Any person may, before November 19, 1982, send by Registered Mail or deliver to the Clerk of the Town of Whitby notice of his or her objection to the proposed designation together with a statement of reasons for the objection and all relevant facts. If such a notice of objection is received, the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Whitby shall refer the matter to the Conservation Review Board for a hearing.
