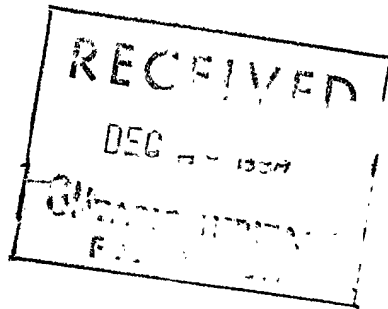



TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Whitby intends to designate the property, including lands and buildings at the following municipal address as property of architectural value or interest under Part 4 of the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O., 1980, c. 337.

REASONS FOR DESIGNATION OF THE ASHBURN SCHOOL HOUSE

Historical

The Ashburn School House was built between 1861 and 1880 for the Trustee's of School Section No. 7 by William Pearson as a test piece to show off his workmanship. Consequently each wall exhibits a different form of stone work. The school was finally closed in 1966 and converted into a community centre for the Ashburn area by the Town of Whitby.

Architectural

The Ashburn School House is an exceptionally fine example of the one room schoolhouse type. It is well crafted and unique in that each facade presents a different type of stone work while maintaining a pleasing overall design.

Any person may, before January 27, 1984, send by registered mail or deliver to the Clerk of the Town of Whitby notice of his or her objection to the proposed designation together with a statement of reasons for the objection and all relevant facts. If such notice of objection is received, the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Whitby shall refer the matter to the Conservation Review Board for a hearing.
