

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Whitby intends to designate the property, including lands and buildings at the following municipal address as property of architectural value or interest under Part 4 of the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O., 1980, c. 337.

202 Byron Street North
Whitby, Ontario

REASONS FOR DESIGNATION OF 202 BYRON STREET NORTH

Historical

202 Byron Street North was built around 1856 by Mr. John Michael. A significant owner of the house was Mr. George Hogarth, Principal of Whitby Collegiate Institute from 1900 to 1910.

Architectural

Originally a frame structure, the house was bricked over in the late 19th Century. The house displays many features from different architectural styles indicating its evolutionary development over time.

Any person may, before March 16, 1984, send by registered mail or deliver to the Clerk of the Town of Whitby notice of his or her objection to the proposed designation together with a statement of reasons for the objection and all relevant facts. If such notice of objection is received, the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Whitby shall refer the matter to the Conservation Review Board for a hearing.
