## Notice of Intention to Designate

**Take notice that** the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Prescott intends to designate the properties including the land and buildings at the following addresses as being of historical or architectural value or interest under Park V of the office office of the office of the office of the office office of the office of the office office

- 1. 724 King Street West Plan 19, Block 3, Lots 50 and 51 (previous home of Frank Wiser, son of J.P. Wiser and Stephen Wiser, Mayor Prescott 1863)
- 763 King Street West Plan 19, Block 3, Part Lot 42 (previous home of Kate Wiser Brown, daughter of J.P. Wiser)
- 3. 741 King Street West Plan 19, Block 3, Lots 41, 43, 44 and Part Lot 42 (previous home of Isaac Wiser, son of J.P. Wiser)

Reasons for Designation:

These buildings were the matrimonial homes of the children of J.P. Wiser and date to the era of early industrial development in Prescott. They are each unique, constitute local landmarks, and remain outstanding examples of nineteenth century architecture.

Through designation, it is intended to recognize and preserve the historical and architectural importance of the community.

Any person may, on or before the 10th day of November 1995, send by registered mail or personal service to the Clerk of the Town of Prescott a notice of objection to the proposed designation together with a statement of the reasons for the objection and all relevant facts. If such a notice is received, Council shall refer the matter to the Conservation Review Board for a hearing.
