- a) The James Irwin House
530 Dibble St. W., Prescott
Plan 19, Block 3, Pt. Lots 38, 39, 40.

Reasons for Designation

1. The house was built by James Irwin, a prosperous Prescott lumber merchant who was six times Mayor of Prescott in the late 1860's and early 1870's.
2. The house is a good example of the Italianate style that was popular at that time period.

- b) The Boyd Building
117-119 King St. W., Prescott
Plan 19, Block 2, Pt. Lot 6

Reasons for Designation

1. This building is a fine example of mid-Victorian commercial building from the early 1870's, a time when Prescott was experiencing a very impressive period of growth.
2. Together with the Stern Building (designated in 1983) and the Keilty Building (proposed for designation in 1984) these buildings form one harmonious whole. Since all three were constructed according to the same basic design, it is extremely important to preserve the facade of all three buildings.

- c) The Keilty Building
121-123 King Street West
Plan 19, Block 2, Pt. Lots 6 & 7

Reasons for Designation

1. This building is a fine example of mid-Victorian commercial building from the early 1870's a time when Prescott was experiencing a very impressive period of growth.
2. Together with the Stern Building (designated in 1983) and the Boyd Building (proposed for designation in 1984). These buildings form one harmonious whole. Since all three were constructed according to the same basic design, it is extremely important to preserve the facade of all three buildings.
