"The Council of the Township of Wilmot intends to designate the property at the
following municipal address as a property of historical and architectual value
under Part IV of the Ontario Heritage Act R.S.O. 1980, chapter 337.
The subject property is located at 60 Snyder's Road West, Baden known as
CASTLE KILBRIDE. The designation described herein is recommended on historic and
architectual grounds - specifically: Front fascade (south) including porch and
entrance, East side fascade up to and including porch, belvedere, outhouse, circular
drive and inlaid stone, interior hallways and staircase both floors, library,
drawing room, ding g room, smoking room and nursery ceiling and shutters.

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Wilmot intends to dseignate the property at the following municipal address as a property of historic and architectural value under Part IV of the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O., 1980, Chapter 337.

> The subject property is located at 60 Snyders Road West in Baden, Ontario; familiarly known as "CASTLE KILBRIDE" and is owned by is intended that in particular the front and east side, including the porches, the belvedere, the inlaid stone, circular drive, and former outhouse be designated. Also to be designated are select interior details of painting, fireplaces, and woodwork in the hallway on both floors, the library, smoking room, parlour, dining room, the nursery, and the front and rear interior staircases. The designation described herein is recommended on historic and architectural grounds. Mr. James Livingston, a prominent local businessman and politician, built this house in 1877. At this time he owned the Dominion Linseed Oil Company, the largest of its kind in the British Empire. He also owned several other enterprises throughout Canada and the United States, for which he gained the title "Flax and Oil King of Canada". He also served as Reeve of Wilmot, member of both Provincial and Federal Parliaments, and was Minister of Mines and Northern Affairs for Sir Wilfrid Laurier. In terms of architecture, the house is a distinguished Italianate mansion, with excellent detailing, including some of the few national examples of the rare trompe l'oeil style of wall and ceiling painting. \(\sum_{\text{\chi}} \)

Any person may, within thirty days of the first publication of this notice, send by registered mail, or deliver to the Clerk of the Township of Wilmot, notice of his or her objection to the proposed designation toghether with a statement of the reasons for the objection and all the relevant facts. If such a Notice of Objection is received, the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Wilmot shall refer the matter to the Conservation Review Board for a hearing.
