





NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Wilmot intends to designate the property at the following municipal address as a property of historic and architectural value under Part IV of the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O., 1980, Chapter 337.

The subject property is located on part of lot 19, Concession North of Bleams Road in the Township of Wilmot, and is owned by [REDACTED]. It is intended that in particular the south front facade, and the east and west sides of the main stone house be designated, including the projecting bay and bargeboard details. The designation described herein is recommended on historic and architectural grounds. William James Scott, the Lord Campfield, a prominent pioneer of the area, built this house in 1858. Mr. Scott was an early township reeve, school commissioner, and prominent businessman, as well as the first planner and postmaster of New Hamburg. In terms of architecture, this is a fine stone house in the Scottish Gothic style. It has several notable features including, its stonework, bargeboard, and projecting bays with Gothic windows.)

Any person may, within thirty days of the first publication of this notice, send by registered mail, or deliver to the Clerk of the Township of Wilmot notice of his or her objection to the proposed designation together with a statement of the reasons for the objection and all the relevant facts. If such a Notice of Objection is received the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Wilmot shall refer the matter to the Conservation Review Board for a hearing.
